WEEKEND MEETS 2001

MOIDART-ONICH 23-25 March 2001

As stated in the last newsletter, Roy has booked 12 places at the Alex McIntyre hut in North Ballachulish for the above weekend. All 12 beds have now been booked by club members. If any other members are interested, it may be possible to hire another room with a sleeping platform, so get in touch with Roy ASAP. Cost of weekend £7 + electricity.

KNOYDART 4-7 May 2001

When Roy announced in the June Newsletter that he had hired the Torrie Shielling Hostel at Inverie, little did he realise that all 12 beds would be snapped up within 7 days! Of the newsletter going out to members. Roy has now added the Kilchoan Farmhouse (8 beds) and the Kilchoan Bunkhouse (6 beds) to our booking to give us a total of 26 beds. At the time of writing 4 of these beds are still available, so any member still interested should contact Roy on 01307 840271 as soon as possible, with a £25 deposit. The total cost of accommodation for 3 nights will be £45 per member. The village of Inverie has a pub, restaurant and post office. The committee hope that most of the members going to Knoydart can get to Mallaig in time for the Friday afternoon ferry which leaves Mallaig at 2pm. The club are to hire a 12 seater boat to take those members who cannot make the ferry, across to Inverie late Friday evening.

KNOYDART CHECKLIST:

1. Contact Roy by Wed 7 February to let him know if you are going by ferry or boat.
2. The balance of the accommodation cost should be paid by 7th March. This is £20 per member.
3. Transport for baggage will be provided from the pier at Inverie to each of the hostels
4. Bed linen is provided at all 3 venues
5. The village shop has now closed down
6. Members who wish to go out for evening meals while staying at Inverie should contact Margaret Baird on 01356-625680 NOW as we are advised to book months in advance !



High Tea

It's about that time again. This year (or rather in January 2001), it will take place in the Castle Campbell Hotel in Dollar at 4.45 pm for 5pm. Cost £8.00. The meet is to the Ochils. The plan is to leave the Myre at 8.30pm for those sharing cars and then to meet again in Dollar at 9.45am. See sketch below. The easiest route is by the A90 to Perth then the M90 to Milnathort and finally the A91 to Dollar.



The plan is to leave from Dollar, walk up through the spectacular Dollar Glen, onto the old drove road which crosses to Glen Devon then to do a round of the Burn of Sorrow. We'll climb steeply onto WhiteWisp (643m), west to Tarmangie (645), across the Maddy Moss to Andrew Gannell Hill (670) and then onto the summit of Ben Cleugh (721), the Ochils' highest top. We'll retrace our steps to Andrew Gannell Hill and climb back over King's Seat (648) and then take in Dollar Hill (346) before returning to the town and our well deserved high tea. Distance 16km. This can be cut short if necessary. For those arriving later there are numerous wee walks around here - maybe walk to the top of Kings Seat to meet the others and see the sunset! (Last year we watched the sunset from the top of East Lomond).
